On August 17, 2023, a visit to the Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE) was carried out by the Accountancy Association of KJ Somaiya College of Arts and Commerce. Students were required to attend a four-day mandatory course that was organised by BSE. The course commenced on August 9, 2023, and ended on August 12, 2023. It was a 45-minute seminar starting from 11:30 a.m. to 12:15 p.m. The speakers for the seminar were Kaushal Mishra, Soniya Mashelkar, and Muzibur Sheikh. The speaker was felicitated by Dr. Hemali Sanghavi on the last day of the session. The visit to BSE provided the students with the opportunity to gain first-hand experience about the functioning of the stock exchange and the Indian capital market. Students were issued a certificate at the end of the visit. They were divided into three batches, each consisting of a minimum of forty students. Students were needed to be present 30 minutes prior to their respective timing allotted to them as per their batches. The students were guided and lent in by their college mentor at BSE Tower; taking photographs or videos and wandering inside the building were strictly prohibited. Everyone was escorted to the 11th floor of the tower to the conference room. Upon settling down, they were introduced to the speaker. The speaker talked about the formation of the BSE and NSE and their roles in the Indian security market ecosystems

He also talked about the fluctuations in prices of shares in the stock market and elaborated on the structure of investment in the Indian stock market. At the end of the session, students were allowed to ask questions. The field visit to BSE provided students with immense knowledge about the functioning of the stock exchange and the Indian capital market. The visit helped to gain a better understanding of the domain of stocks in the financial as well as trading sectors and about the technology and systems used to support these organizations. In general, it was a brilliant educational visit.


Highlights:



HIGHLIGHTS:

The N.S.S. Unit of K. J. Somaiya College of Arts and Commerce (Autonomous) conducted an Introductory Workshop on the Choomacchar campaign on 6th November, 2023. The Choomacchar Campaign is a Survey-based activity initiated to prevent the expansion of disease-carrying mosquitoes and learn how to overcome the effects caused by them. The workshop commenced at 11:00 a.m., featuring Riddhi Khandar, who emphasized the severity of vector-borne diseases, focusing on malaria and dengue. The importance of early detection and treatment of these diseases was stressed. The workshop provided insights into identifying, reporting, and eliminating breed spots. The volunteers received information regarding the prevention methods for preventing potential breeding spots, both inside and outside the home, by avoiding the collection and stagnation of water anywhere and covering all stored water at all times. Ms. Khandar also emphasized mobilizing the local government by using Helpline No. 1916 or

an app by BMC called 'Mumbai against Dengue'. The volunteers were encouraged to show maximum participation and to engage with their local communities through door-to-door interventions for awareness campaigns Khandar informed the volunteers of the modus operandi upon visiting the houses, including introducing themselves, explaining campaign objectives, educating people about disease prevention, and conducting follow-up visits to remind them to continue to take preventive measures. For the campaign, they received toolkits, which included an ID card for legitimacy, laminated cue cards in English and Hindi to explain preventivemeasures, and a record-keeping form. Underage volunteers were required to submit a consent form for participation. The timeline of the Choomacchar Campaign was clarified, with participants having one month to complete the activity. On completion of the activity, they would receive certificates cosigned by BMC authorities. The workshop concluded with a Q&A session, during which participants were able to address any queries or concerns. A majority of the attendees expressed willingness to be a part of this campaign, reflecting a shared determination to combat vector-borne diseases and their impact on the community.
